



1	Professor Lennon has been my absolute favorite online professor to date. He has 3 assignments per week that are challenging, thought-provoking, and applicable. They inspire interaction with students and the professor also makes an effort to respond to most students' responses. He creates video responses for subjects that are a little tricky and that was incredibly helpful. Sometimes students need that sort of interaction. I can't thank him enough!
2	This is the first online class I have had (out of 20-25 classes including undergrad courses completed at a different school) in which the instructor connected with students via Youtube. This is awesome! The one difficult thing about online classes is that if instructors aren't really involved with their students, students can begin to feel isolated and as if they are teaching themselves. 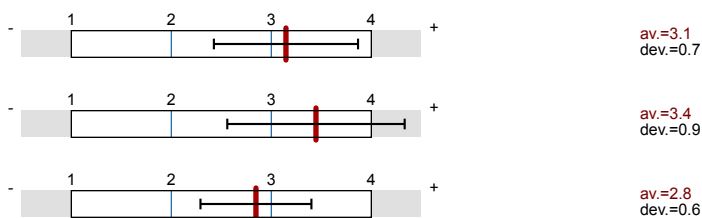

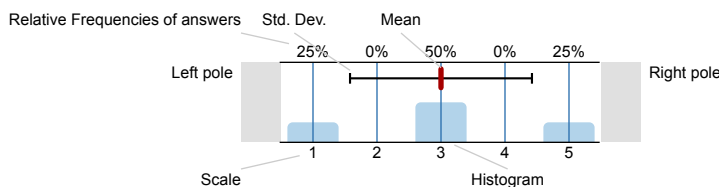
